- b. <u>Voter Registration Poster/Flyer Distribution</u>—Kathy Reim reported that 150 posters have been distributed and are displayed in local businesses, thanks to the efforts of Andrea Doll, Peggy Raterman, Becky Rosencrans, Jay Bowen and many PFLAG volunteers. These are PERMANENT resources and the businesses have been enthusiastic to help. Also, Barbara R took the QR code flyers to many of the local school districts for display there.

d. Voter Registration Drives at Food Banks—Kate Dahlstedt

- iv. Sedro-Woolley's Food distribution location is a Food Pavilion where Kate D has been heading up the effort.
- v. Interpreters from Community Action's Latino Advisory Committee have volunteered at the food bank sites as well as interpreters Jo Beecher, Katie Carson, Katherine Myrvold, Vicki Hawkinson, Anna Chotzen, Kate Smith, and Jonathan Gutierrez.
- e. Postcarding project is now underway to thank those running for political office (Carol Sullivan provided the PostCard kits.) Article on this project will appear in the State League's Voter publication on November 6!
- f. Speak up Schools planning has begun—joint effort between Snohomish and Skagit Leagues to prepare community members to give effective testimony when Redistricting Commission public hearings are held early next year.
